

NOTES

- Exams are in the gym unless your instructor notifies you of an exception.
- Evening Classes: Verify date and time with Instructor. May be scheduled during the day.
- Friday start/end times are non-standard.

GYM EXAMS

- Do not bring cell phones or other electronics to the gym.
- Only bring materials that your Instructor has approved. Example: calculators, reference sheets.
- Make sure you have enough pens/pencils.
- You are expected to be on time. You may be allowed into the gym up to 30 minutes after the start of the exam if a valid reason is presented. After 30 minutes, regardless of reason, no entry will be permitted.
- You must stay in the gym for at least 30 minutes after the start of the exam.

Phyllis Davidson Scholarship

The Phyllis Davidson Easter Seals Scholarship offers post-secondary academic scholarships to students living with physical disabilities.

Each year one \$20,000 scholarship will be awarded to a successful applicant at \$5,000 per academic year for four years. Scholarships are given to qualified students in a post-secondary program in Alberta. The funds are only to be used on educational expenses (i.e. tuition, books, etc.). SCAN OR CLICK TO APPLY

Norman Denoon Memorial Scholarship

The Norman Denoon Memorial Easter Seals Scholarship offers post-secondary academic scholarships to students living with disabilities.

Scholarships of \$5,000 per school year are given to qualified students in a post-secondary program in Alberta. The funds are only to be used on educational expenses (i.e. tuition, books, etc.).



Workplace Readiness Mentorship Scholarship Program

The Workplace Readiness Mentorship Program, funded by Sun Life, provides scholarships to students with a disability who are entering or currently enrolled in post-secondary in Alberta or Northwest Territories.

Scholarships of \$2,000 per school year are given to qualified students. Successful applicants will also be matched with a volunteer mentor to provide guidance and assist with preparing to enter the workforce.

\$1500 Leadership and Service Scholarship

Did you get involved during the 23/24 school year at Burman or in the community? Did you hold a leadership position or take part in regular volunteering? If so, there is probably a scholarship for you!

Deadline: April 30, 2024

Eligibility

This award is for students who are returning to Burman University next school year, and who have not previously received a renewable leadership scholarship scholarship. If you received an entrance leadership scholarship you're still eligible! (If your student ID starts with 23, 22, or 21, you are eligible.) Please reach out with any questions!

Requirements:

- Be a current Burman University student and be returning the following school year.
- Have completed 12 credits each Fall and Winter term of the current and upcoming school year.
- Achieve a 2.3 or 2.5 GPA in the current school year (requirement depends on program)
- Apply by April 30
- References in by May 15
- Hold a leadership or service position during the current school year.
- *Paid hourly employment and course requirements are not eligible.
- *Students receiving a second-degree discount are not eligible.

Claiming Your Award

- To claim the award a student must register for and successfully complete a minimum 80% course load per term (12 credits excluding PLAR and Audit Credit) during the upcoming Fall and Winter terms.
- Total award amount will be divided equally between the two terms of the upcoming school year.
- The eligibility to apply for and receive this award is based on the length of degree and initial enrolment status. i.e.
- Initial enrolment status Freshman in a 4-year degree: May apply up to 3 years
- Initial enrolment status Post Secondary Transfer in a 4-year degree: May apply up to 2 years
- *If a student withdraws below the minimum course load the scholarship will be reversed for that term.

SUMMER PARKING

If you want to leave a vehicle on campus while you are gone over the summer, there are a few steps you MUST follow.

- Park the vehicle in lot D, Gravel Parking behind the Science Centre
- Come to Facility Maintenance and fill out a form for summer parking along with a set of keys that allow us to move the vehicle in the event work needs to be done in the lot it is parked in
- Contact number for you during the summer.

• Current insurance on your vehicle. This can be Parking insurance if you wish.

This applies to **REGISTERED VEHICLE ONLY** with Parking tags.

Unregistered vehicles will be considered abandoned and police will remove them from campus.

SUMMER MINISTRIES SCHOLARSHIP

Students who are paid by the Seventh-Day Adventist Church (including Burman) for summer service may receive a scholarship equal to 30% of summer ministry earnings deposited on their account by August 31, with verification from the employer of the summer earnings. The maximum award from any one or combination of "Summer" scholarships is \$1,000. Click the link for more info.
