They will also be willing and able to represent the Religious Studies department, Burman University, and the Seventh-day

Adventist church in a wide variety of public settings.

The ideal candidate will be committed to excellence in teaching, advising, and mentoring students. Other responsibilities include academic advising and service on university-wide committees. The successful candidate will have a strong commitment to Christian higher education, and be a dedicated Seventh day Adventist Christian committed to integrating his or her faith with teaching and scholarship. The successful candidate will possess an understanding of adult learning practices and the ability to apply that understanding in the context of university Religious Studies education. Applicants should have ability to use technology effectively in teaching and learning, bring real-world experiences to the classroom and student research projects, the ability to work collaboratively, and evidence of scholarly activity. Applicants must be eligible to work in Canada.

Qualifications: An earned PhD in Religious Studies with major expertise in biblical studies, New

Testament, biblical languages, or a related field is required. Preference will be given to candidates with demonstrated capability in teaching at the post-secondary level. A demonstrated commitment to Seventh-day Adventist education, to community service, and to research and writing for scholarly publications is expected. Pastoral

experience is an asset.
