MATURE STUDENT HOUSING POLICY

- 1. All students who are 31+ years old at Burman University are required to apply for campus housing through the housing committee of Burman University. (see link below)
- 2. Housing will be assessed on an individual basis.
- 3. Exception to the Housing Policy does not establish new policy.
- 4. Residence Hall housing (Lakeview Hall, Riverton Hall, Redstone, Maple Hall) are under the direction and discretion of the Residence Deans. Lakeview Hall is set up to meet the needs of all students under the age of 23 who are allowed to live in residence housing.
- 5. All students between the ages of 23 and 30 may apply for housing in all residences except for Lakeview Hall. Students under the age of 23 may be placed under the Deans' discretion in Riverton Hall as well. Rooms at this location is limited.

Alternative Housing

Mature students attending Burman University should be proactive in establishing living accommodations before the school year begins. Looking online for housing in the community as well as contacting the Student Services office is recommended to assist in finding the proper housing situation that could meet the needs of mature students. (**Tip: A great time to find community housing for September is between May and August. Contact student services for more information**)

Housing Committee

Burman University does have a Housing Committee to assess individual housing needs. You are able to make a request in writing outlining your individual needs if you prefer to live on campus. The committee will then approve or deny your request. You will then be contacted by Student Services notifying you of the decision.

In cases of mature student status, we as a campus recognize that providing/recommending the proper living arrangements is key to being successful. (A link can be found below)
